

The Latin American Invitational, curated by Gables art maven Virginia Miller, is a mix of emerging and established artists from all points south, "the master artists of tomorrow," Miller says. The exhibit includes nearly three dozen original paintings, photographs and tabletop sculpture. There's a fragile beauty to many of the pieces, such as Venezuelan artist Carolina Rodriguez-Baptista's bronze figures Ying Yang, shown above, sailing through space and the deep reds, ochres and aquas bleeding into each other in Colombian Guillermo Londoño's evocative paintings. Nicaraguan Leonidas Correa's introspective photos, Costa Rican Beach, oddly touching, feel like fragments of memory. And no Latin American exhibit can completely escape magical realism — here it comes from Salvadoran Santiago Beltran Valladares' disembodied, dreamlike paintings.
